COLLEGE OF MARIN TRUSTEES ELECT NEW OFFICERS *Re-elected Trustees Take Oath at December Meeting*

KENTFIELD, Calif., Dec. 14, 2005—College of Marin trustees elected new officers last night at its regular monthly board meeting. Effective immediately, Greg Brockbank will serve as president, Carole Hayashino as vice president, and Wanden Treanor as clerk. Each officer will serve a one-year term.

Greg Brockbank has been a trustee since 1989, including 10 years as a board officer, including vice president in 2005. This will be his third stint as board president. Carole Hayashino has been a trustee since 2003, and served as clerk this past year. Wanden Treanor has been a trustee since 1994.

“The new board officers will provide stable, experienced, and skilled leadership as College of Marin enters a critical period, said College president Dr. Frances White. “During 2006, we will make bold decisions about the College’s programs, services, and facilities. I am confident our new officers, and the board as a whole, are up to the challenge.”

Also at last night’s meeting, three trustees took their oath of office after being re-elected by Marin voters last month. Marin County judge Faye D’Opal issued the oath to Barbara Dolan, Greg Brockbank and Wanden Treanor.
