Typical Coursework associated with the study of Sociology

Sociology programs are designed to broaden the student's understanding of the behavior of people in groups, and of the organization and the functioning of society. Sociologists study such areas as bureaucracy, community, deviant behavior, family, public opinion, social change, social mobility, social stratification, and such specific problems as crime, divorce, child abuse, and substance addiction. Class instruction includes lectures, reading, research, and related writing. In addition to general background courses in the liberal arts, such as history and English, course work in Sociology includes all or most of the following: Criminology and Delinquency, Industrial Sociology, Marriage and Family, Race Relations, Research Methods, Social Movements, Social Psychology, Social Stratification, The Family & Urban Sociology.
