

Overview

- Established in 1926, College of Marin (COM) is located approximately 15 miles north of San Francisco in Marin County. The College consists of two campuses. The Kentfield Campus is located in Central Marin; the Indian Valley Campus is located in North Marin.
- The Kentfield Campus consists of seventeen permanent buildings and several portable buildings. The campus is located on seventy-seven acres of land. The Indian Valley Campus has twenty-two buildings and is situated on 333 acres. The College employs 341 permanent staff and faculty and many part-time employees.
- The College offers more than sixty degree programs leading to an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree. Over thirty Career Certificates with various specialties are offered. The College has established over 200 articulation and transfer agreements with the University of California, California State University, and private colleges.

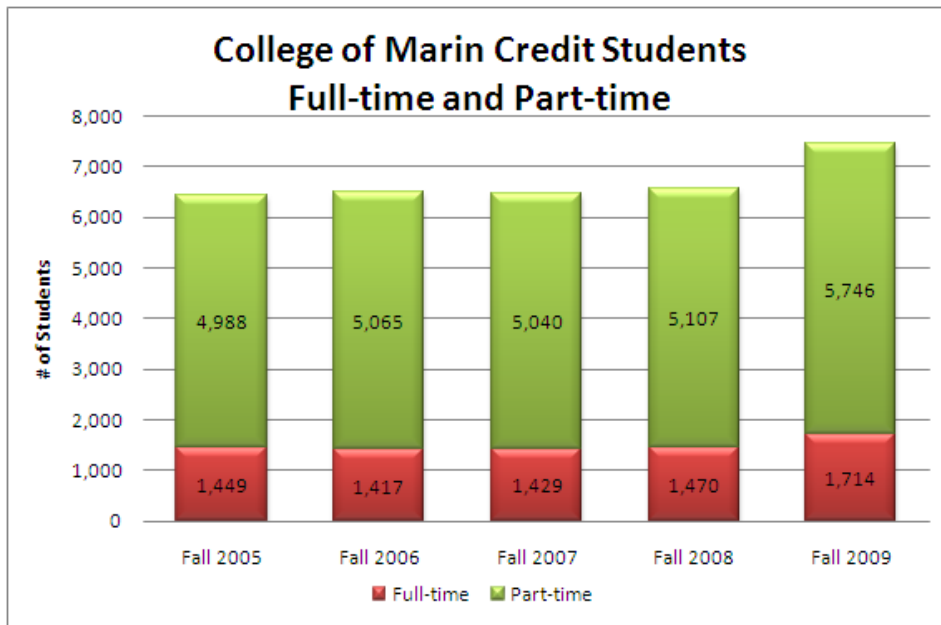

A. Full-time and Part-time Students

- College of Marin offers credit and noncredit courses. Noncredit courses are short-term, not given for credit, and not graded. For information on our noncredit classes, please consult the credit/noncredit schedule and our Community Education schedule or call 415.485.9305.
- Courses that can be applied towards a degree or transfer to another college are offered through our credit program. Many services such as counseling, financial aid, and job placement are available. For information on our credit courses, please consult our credit class schedule or call 415.457.8811.
- Student characteristics in this report are for the credit program only. There are 8,025 credit students enrolled in 971 classes for Spring 2010. The majority of students attend College of Marin part-time (78%).

- In Spring 2010, 971 credit classes are being taught at College of Marin; 797 classes are at the Kentfield Campus and 174 classes are at the Indian Valley Campus. Classes are offered in the daytime, evening, and Saturdays. Classes are taught in a variety of formats, including lecture classes, Internet classes, telecourses, and work experience.
- The following chart displays the trend for the past 5 years for Fall enrollment for full-time and Part-time credit students.

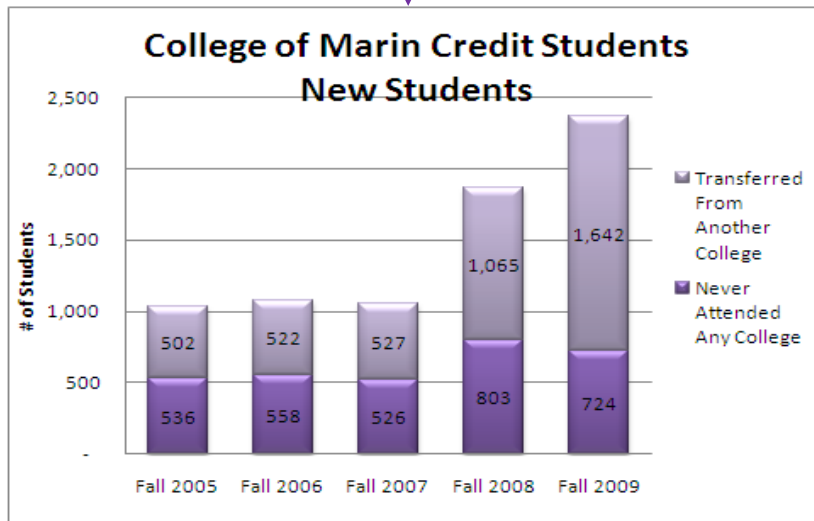
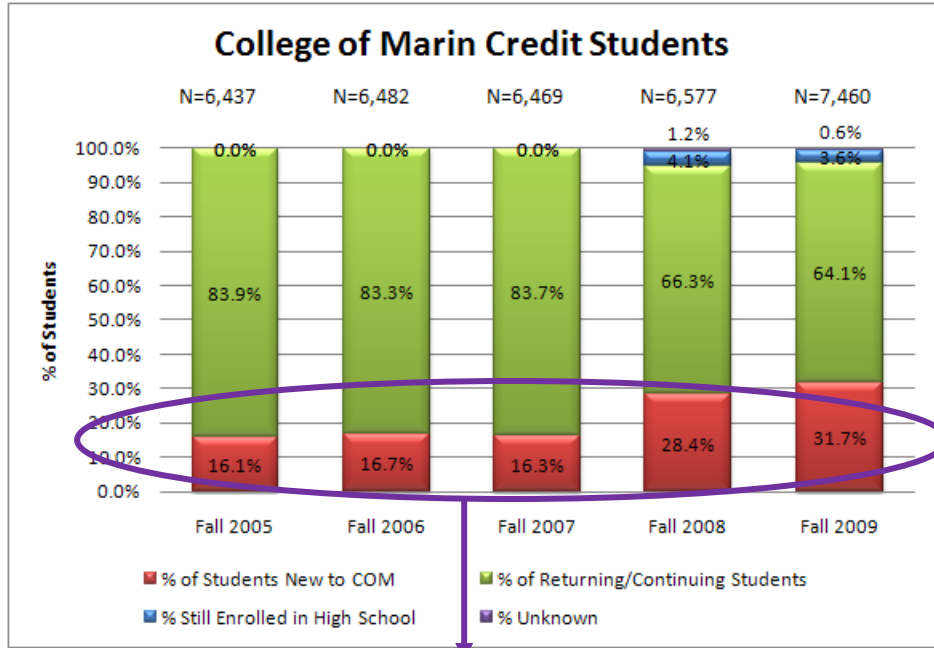


B. New Students

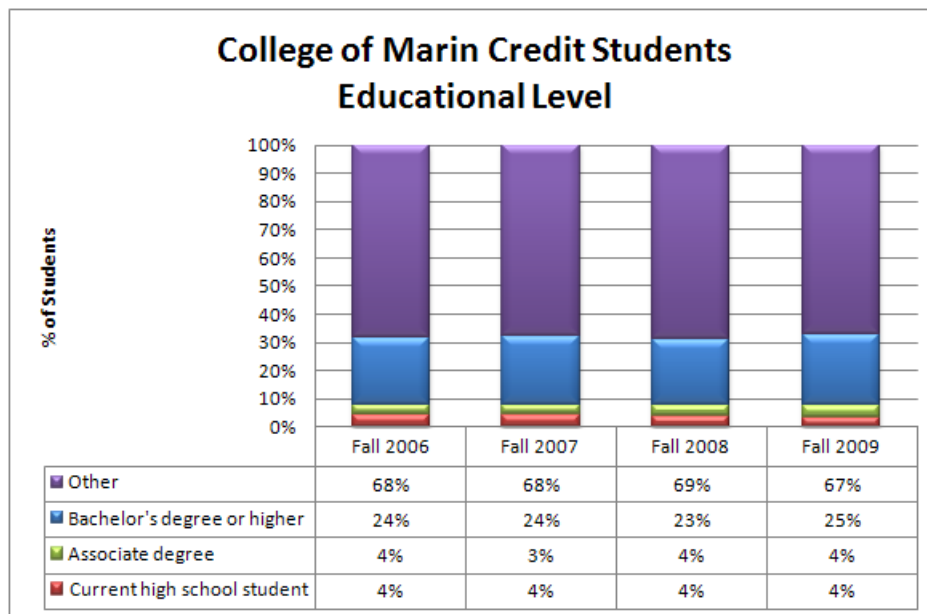


C. Student Education Level

D. Student Gender

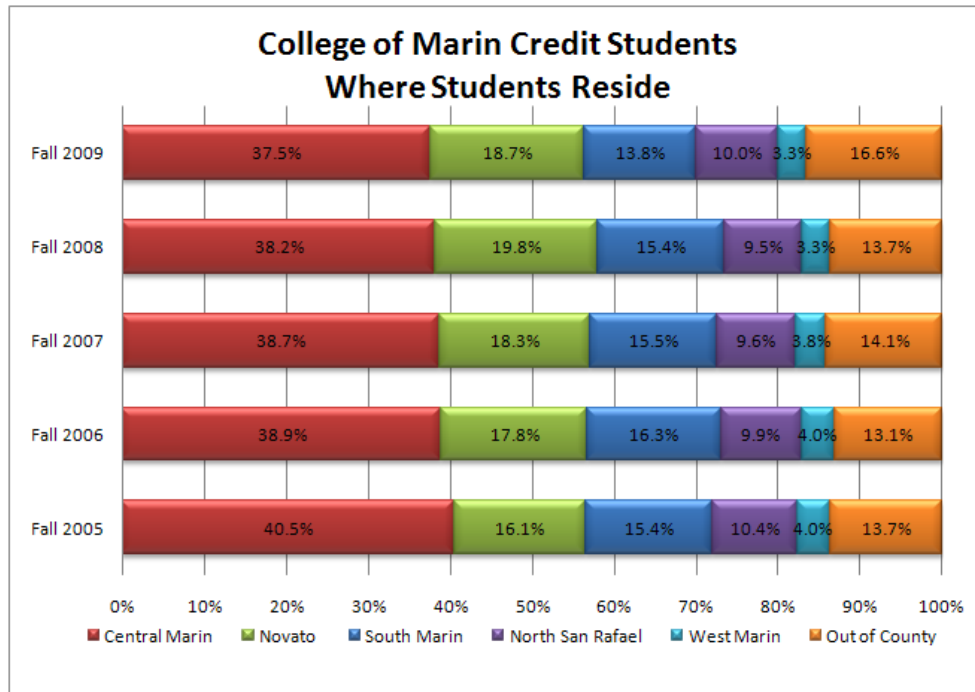
- The College's credit student population is composed of 40% men and 59% women. One percent of students declined to answer the question.

- Most College of Marin students are Marin residents (85%). Of the remaining 15%, the majority come from San Francisco, the East Bay, and Sonoma County. The number of foreign students attending CoM on a student visa is 66. Foreign international students are already included where they listed their address.

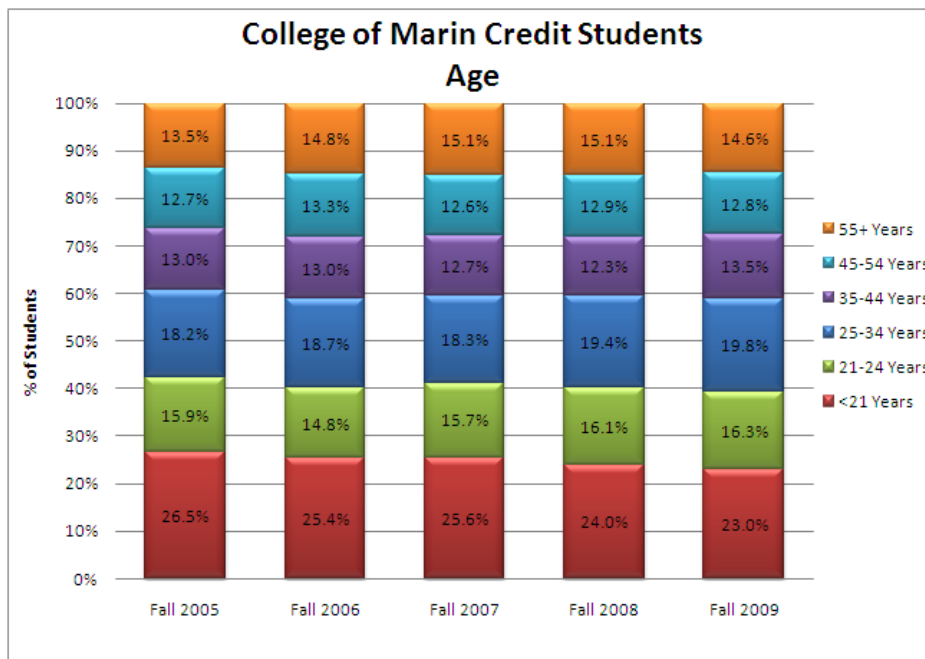

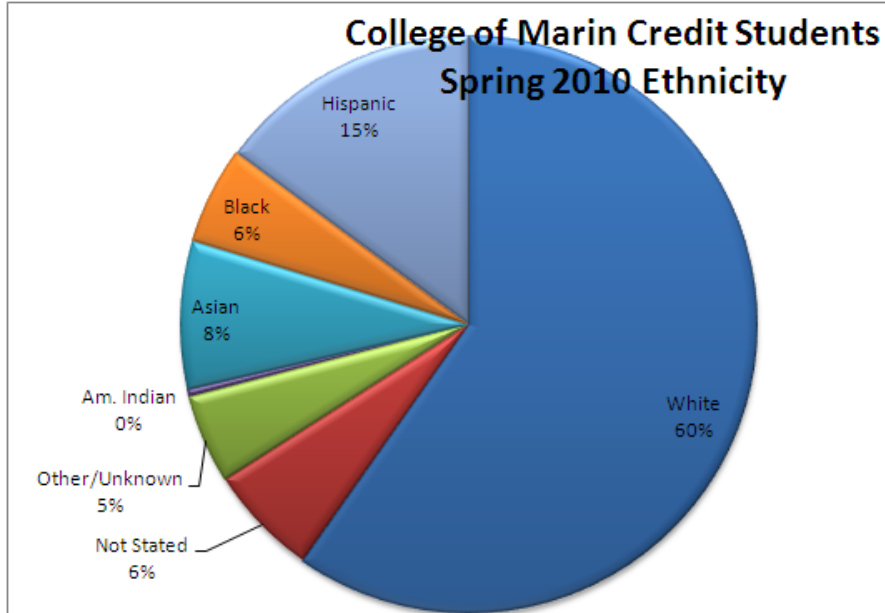
F. Age of Students

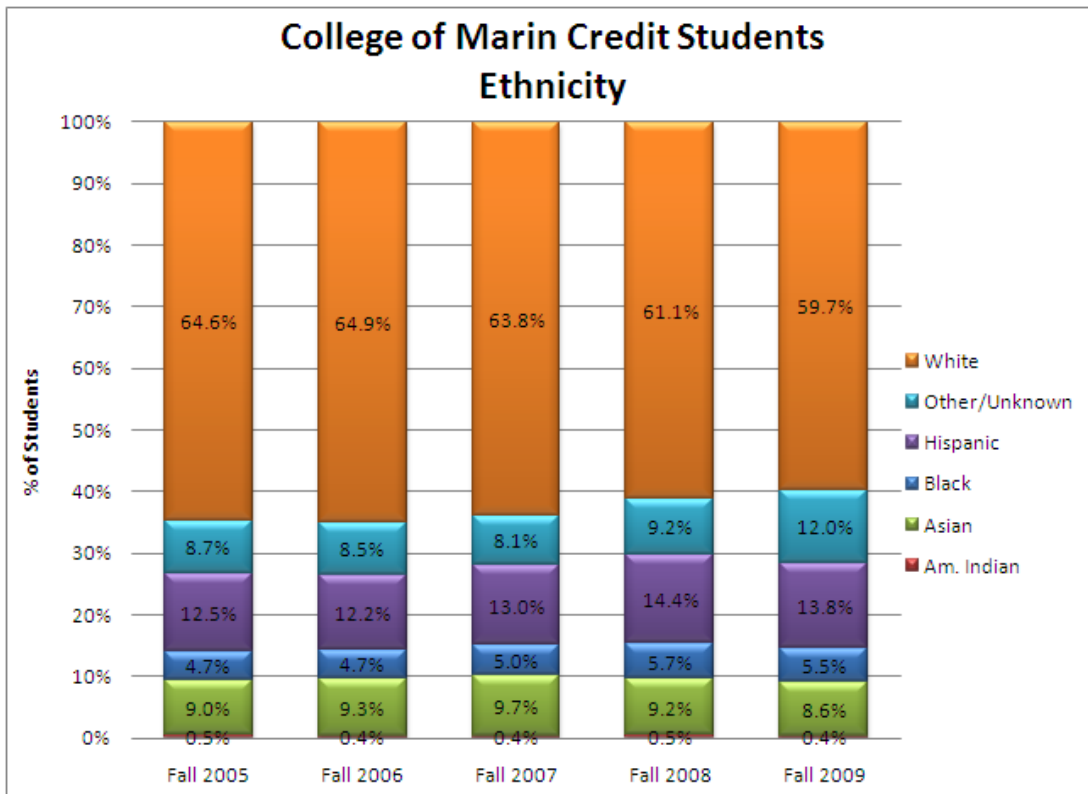


G. Student Ethnicity

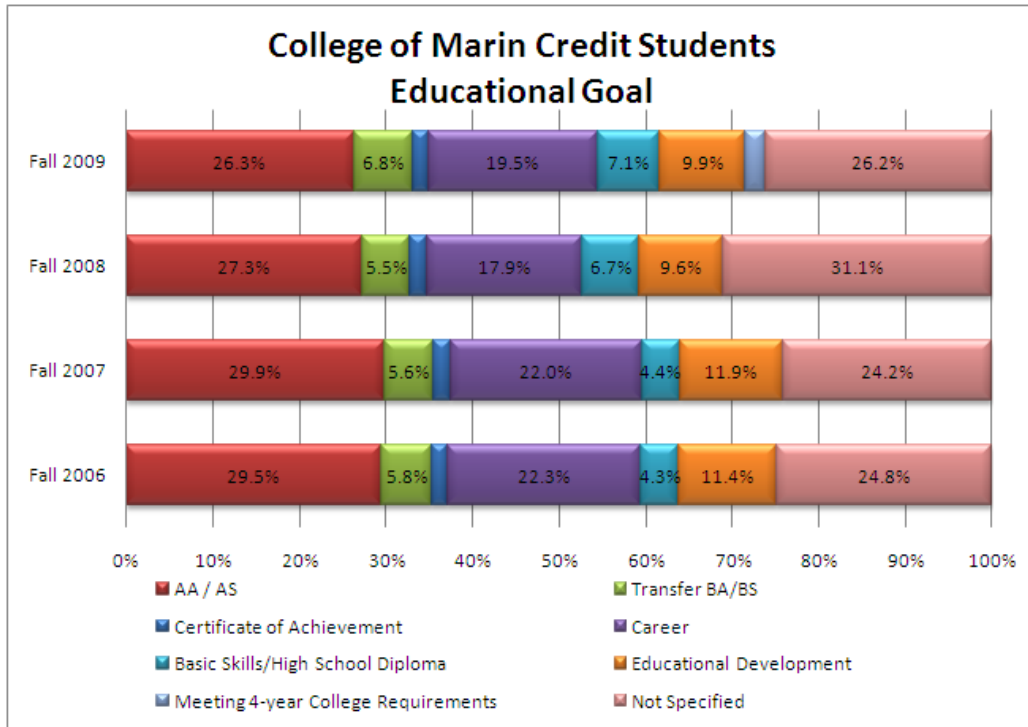


H. Student Educational Goal
